The competitive aspect of Pitch and Putt is a main focus of the PPUI and ensuring that all its members have an opportunity to compete against their peers is a priority. The best of facilities should be available to members when they enter Provincial and National Championships and the PPUI endeavour to support clubs to provide this.

The PPUI have a great responsibility to provide training opportunities for its members. The PPUI in partnership with Sport Ireland Coaching will provide opportunities for people to get on the coaching ladder and pass on their knowledge to future generations of Pitch and Putt players. The PPUI also commit to providing the best of supports to its coaches in terms of regular training and the updating of coaching resources. The introduction in 2016 of the PPUI National Handicap System also brings about the need for the PPUI to provide training in the use of this resource. The PPUI will ensure that new and existing club officers will have training resources available to them and that these resources are regularly updated.

The PPUI have a major role in the promotion of the sport of Pitch and Putt and the activities within. This is an area where the landscape is ever changing, and society is constantly evolving in how it gathers and processes information. The PPUI will need to keep up with modern communication methods and ensure that our message gets to its target audience.

The Strategic Plan 2017 – 2021 is a vital cog in the development of the sport of Pitch and Putt but is entirely dependent on one vital resource, people. We need the support of all PPUI members, clubs and county boards to ensure the success of this plan. I firmly believe that this
